

# Fundraising Campaign in support of Dementia Care



## The Challenge

Effective dementia care requires more than medical treatment. Both research and our own



experience at York Care Centre show that a therapeutic and home-like environment significantly enhances the quality of life for individuals living with dementia and other memory challenges.

Much has been learned about memory care since the advanced memory care floor known as Tower 2 opened at the York Care Center. Today, Tower 2 is as it was in 2010. We now know that this environment does not include the specialized features necessary to support the cognitive, emotional, and physical well-being of residents with dementia.

Many individuals with dementia respond positively to environments that remind them of home. Incorporating familiar design elements like cottage-style décor and natural colours can evoke feelings of comfort and belonging.

The layout, décor, and communal spaces in Tower 2 were not created with this population in mind. Bright, bold colours currently dominate the space, which can cause agitation and discomfort for residents. The lack of sensory stimulation and limited access to engaging environments make delivering the best possible care to our residents challenging.

These challenges underscore the importance of investing in transforming Tower 2 into a supportive, engaging, and therapeutic environment for individuals with dementia.

This \$150,000 project will create a homelike, calming environment that promotes comfort and reduces the challenging symptoms of dementia, such as restlessness, anxiety, and depression.

# What Residents will Experience

 Reduced agitation, anxiety, and confusion in a calming and familiar space

 Sensory-rich elements like interactive wall art and textured surfaces



- A thoughtfully designed space with tactile features encouraging residents to interact with their surroundings
- A new home-like dining environment to enhance mealtime experiences and increase motivation to eat, leading to better nutrition and overall health
- A sense of safety and comfort with soft, soothing colours and a home-like setting to mitigate challenging behaviours like aggression, wandering, or restlessness
- Clear visual cues to help navigate their environment independently, fostering a sense of control and self-worth
- Comfortable lounge areas and inviting communal spaces promote social interactions that improve emotional well-being
- Sensory products offer a multisensory experience stimulating memory and cognitive function while reducing feelings of isolation or withdrawal

### How will we do this?

#### 1. Renovation of Dining Room, Common Areas and Nurses Station.\$75,000

Our plan includes repainting the hallways, dining room and lounge areas in soft, calming shades such as light pink, soft yellow, green, and blue. The addition of cottage-style siding around the kitchen and nurses' stations further enhances the home-like environment, making the unit feel less institutional and more comforting.

**CURRENT** 

The new "Sunset Diner," will resemble a cozy, familiar diner and encourage social interaction during meals. This design is expected to boost residents' nutritional intake and foster a sense of community.

Custom wallpaper will be used to provide visuals of familiar New Brunswick locations and landmarks, which can spark memory and reminiscence.





## 2. Sensory Products for Engagement (\$50,000)

Investments in sensory tools like 3D textured wall art, interactive projection devices and robotic pets stimulate residents' physical and cognitive abilities. These items allow residents to engage with their environment in a meaningful way, reducing a sensory.



meaningful way, reducing agitation and boredom which are common symptoms of dementia.

#### 3. Balcony Refresh (\$5,000)

The two balconies in Tower 2 currently overlook the parking lot and rooftops, providing little visual stimulation. By adding green patio turf, flower decals, artificial shrubs, and new furnishings, we aim to create a more outdoor-like setting that feels fresh and engaging, contributing to a more therapeutic environment.

## 4. Establish a Renewal Fund (\$20,000)

As technologies and research advance, an investment of \$20,000 will create a renewal fund for memory care support at York

Care Center. The fund will support future renovations, maintenance, and acquisitions to support memory care residents. The fund will also provide a long-term investment opportunity for future donations, bequests and memorial gifts to support residents.
